

If we got something wrong, we'll apologise and where possible we'll try to put things right.

We also aim to learn from our mistakes and use the information we gain to improve our services.

What is a complaint?

A complaint is an expression of dissatisfaction with our service.

Have you asked us yet?

If you are approaching us for a service for the first time, then this policy doesn't apply. You should first give us a chance to respond to your request.

Dealing with your complaint

Informal Raise your concern with the person you're dealing with. They will try to resolve it within 10 working days. If you're still not happy you can ask for a formal investigation.

Formal An investigation will be undertaken by an officer within the Complaints Team, who are independent of the service subject to the complaint. This will be completed within 20 working days and you will be provided with a response detailing the findings and conclusions.

What we expect from you

We believe that everyone has the right to be heard, understood and respected.

We, therefore, expect you to be polite and courteous in your dealings with us. We will not tolerate aggressive or abusive behaviour, unreasonable demands or persistence.
