The draft Annual Report to the Welsh Government was presented to the Wrexham Schools Admission Forum on 10 November 2011 for discussion and agreement prior to submission by 30 November 2011. During discussions it was apparent that there was confusion about what constituted 'consultation on admission arrangements' by admission authorities within the forum area.

Guidance on such consultation is outlined in the School Admissions Code July 2009. In order to ensure that admission authorities within the forum area met the requirement of the Code it was agreed that a meeting with the Diocesan Schools Officer and the Admissions Manager should take place in order to further discuss the matter. The Local Authority is required to monitor whether other admission authorities' admission arrangements are compliant with the Code and that consultation takes place as outlined in the Code.

The Local Authority will, in future Annual Reports, list the names of admission authorities who do not carry out a formal consultation on their admission arrangements, as required by the Welsh Government.

Please outline what admission arrangements have been put in place to serve the interests of vulnerable children

To ensure that the needs of vulnerable children are met during the Admissions Process a number of key officers liaise closely with staff in the Admission Section. Where pupils have a Statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN), the relevant SEN Officers work with Admissions to inform them of likely placements which may be different from their local mainstream school. This is particularly important for those pupils likely to attend a special school or resourced provision within a mainstream school.

Children who are Looked After (LAC) have their needs met by support from the LAC Education Co-ordinator who liaises with Admissions and ensures that their LAC status is reflected in the admissions process where they are given highest priority in the over-subscription criteria. Pupils for whom English is an Additional Language (EAL) are supported by the EAL Service and part of the service's remit is to ensure smooth admission into school for EAL pupils, making sure that both the family and school are fully prepared for the admission. In addition, staff from Behaviour Support and the Travellers Education Service will support pupils at times of admission or transfer between schools. The Education Social Work Service will also work with admissions to ensure that vulnerable pupils (and their families) are assisted through the admissions process.

Where "complex" transfers have been requested (involving pupils with a number of exclusions or on the brink of an exclusion), the Complex Transfer Protocol is adopted and this involves senior LA officers considering the merits /potential difficulties of such a transfer. In such cases, the involvement of support services is usually recommended (eg attendance at an admission meeting).

Please explain how well in-year agreed admission procedures are working and the number of children admitted to each school under the procedures

Wrexham has an agreed mid-phase school transfer procedure, with the LA being the first point of contact for all such requests within the County. This process is working well. It enables the Admission Team to keep the central pupil database up to date and assists the early identification of 'vulnerable' children. In addition guidelines have been agreed for dealing with more complex and difficult transfer requests, particularly at year 10/11 where these years are considered to be a 2 year course; transfer requests to other schools within Wrexham, after Year 9, could have a negative impact on pupils' academic progress and are not therefore considered appropriate by the LA.

Information is available to parents through the LA's composite prospectus. Straight forward transfers are subject to a 15 school day turnaround, although transfers where there are significant issues such as behavioural difficulties may take longer.

Please provide a summary of the key admission issues in the area and how the forum has addressed them

School Organisation

The LA is working to implement the recommendations of the Primary Review Report (March 2007) which includes the amalgamation of infant and junior schools. Since March 2007 amalgamations have taken place at Gwersyllt, Llay, Penycae, Rhos, Rhosymedre, Acton, Gwenfro, Hafod y Wern, Victoria and there are on-going consultations of the proposal to amalgamate Chirk Infants and Ceiriog Juniors.

The standalone nursery provision at Erddig has been discontinued with replacement provision made available at Victoria CP School and St Giles VA School. Caia Nursery school will continue to focus on supporting pupils who find difficulty in settling into early years settings across the County Borough. It will admit 15 mainstream pupils and 15 with additional learning needs.

Following the enactment of Federation Regulations (Wales) the LA awaits the response of the three schools (Ysgol Cynddelw, Ysgol Llanarmon, Ysgol Pontfadog). It is expected that the schools will enter into a federation arrangement during the current academic year.

Following a public consultation on the future of Welsh medium education in the North of the County the LA has been successful in securing funding from SBIG to provide a new school. Following a period of formal consultation it is expected to open in September 2013. In the meantime the temporary arrangements at Ysgol Plas Coch will continue.

The LA has developed a Strategic Outline Plan for the 21st Century Schools programme. In order to inform Band B proposals an area based review will be undertaken, beginning with the Town Centre. The Admission Forum will be consulted on any proposals resulting from the reviews.

Transition

All schools in Wrexham are allocated to one of 10 clusters of schools which are based on a secondary school and its identified feeder primary schools. Each cluster has a Transition Plan which describes how the cluster schools will work together to support the transition of pupils from primary to secondary school.

Clusters of schools work closely together to plan schemes of work, share good practice and resources in order to ensure that there is continuity in teaching and learning for pupils as they move from primary to secondary school. Secondary and primary teachers in the cluster meet to moderate pupil work to ensure that there is consistency in assessment between the schools. A range of information is passed from primary to secondary schools in the cluster in order to track pupil progress during transition and ensure that all pupils are achieving their full potential.

School Admissions

The Forum have received reports on allocations and appeals for the 2011/12 admission round and have been informed of oversubscription resulting in pressures for places for certain areas in Wrexham.

The Welsh Government, through the Welsh Schools Admission Officers' Group, have asked LAs to monitor that their aided schools have admissions policies that are compliant with the School Admissions Code, that they consult on their admission policies within the timescale required by the Education (Determination of Admission Arrangements) (Wales) Regulations 2006, and that they carry out impact assessments on their admission policies. The Forum will monitor this and will also consult on a common timetable and an agreement to operate equal preferences.
