Infant – Junior Transfer for September 2009

The School Standards and Framework Act (1998) enables you to express a preference for the junior school you would wish your child to attend. To help you to do this, the Local Education Authority (LEA) has to publish certain information about its schools and policies, which, together with the prospectus that the school has prepared, will help you state your preference. A copy of the County Borough's 'Parents' and Carers' Guide to Education Services in Wrexham' accompanies this pack. Further copies are available at the Authority's schools, offices and, for reference purposes, at public libraries. If you wish to visit a school prior to expressing your preference, you should arrange to make an appointment with the Headteacher. You will then be able to express your preference on the basis of the information contained in these documents and on the basis of any visit(s) you have made to the school(s). *Please refer to page 6 of the publication mentioned above.*

Please note that the law does not allow you to choose a school for your child, merely to state a preference for your child to attend at a particular school. Of course, every effort will be made to ensure that your child gets a place at your preferred school.

The Authority will accept only the pupil's home address and not that, for example, of childminder or grandparents. Parents may be asked to provide official documentation showing home address. Parents are advised that a school place may be lawfully withdrawn if the information given on your application form is fraudulent or misleading, the consequence of this may be that there would be no place available at your next nearest school. If two parents cannot agree which school/schools they prefer, they must seek independent legal advice, and if necessary an appropriate court order, before submitting their one application form to the LEA.

If your child has a disability which could affect his/her progress and participation in school life, please note this on the form.

If your child has a Statement of Special Educational Need, the LEA will try its best to allow your preference of junior school but it has to make sure that the school can meet your child's needs fully. After your form has been received, an LEA Officer will write to you and may wish to arrange a meeting to discuss your child's education at junior school.

If your child has an older brother or sister currently registered at the preferred school who will still be registered at the time the younger one is due to start, please note on the admission form, giving his/her name and date of birth.

Please note that there is no guarantee of a place at your preferred junior school, as it is a separate school to the infant school.

Please complete the enclosed admission form and return it to the headteacher of the current school by 17 October 2008. The Admitting Authority will admit pupils up to the school's Admission Number (*this number is shown in the school list in the 'Parents' and Carers' Guide to Education Services in Wrexham'*). Late applications will be dealt with after all those that have been handed in by the deadline. It is, therefore, very important for you to meet the deadline referred to above.

In the event that there are more applications made than there are places available at your preferred school, the Admission Authority will apply the criteria published in the County Borough's 'Parents' and Carers' Guide to Education Services in Wrexham' to allocate places at that school.

It will take some time for the allocation process to be completed but you will be informed by **16 March 2009** whether or not your child has been allocated a place at your preferred school.

If the LEA is unable to allocate a place for your child at your preferred school, you will have the right to make representations to an independent Appeals Panel.

If you wish to appeal in the case of a community school, you should write to the Chief Learning and Achievement Officer. For pupils with statements or for whom a statement is in process this procedure is dealt with by Mrs Ann Pumford, Pupil Support Officer. She is based at 16 Lord Street, Wrexham and can be contacted on 01978 297505.

Admission to community junior schools is governed by the Authority's Admissions Policy. Please note that, should you choose a school other than the nearest junior school, the Authority will not be in a position to provide transport for your child and consequently you will have responsibility to make and pay for such arrangements. Details about the Transport Policy are set out in the County Borough's 'Parents' and Carers' Guide to Education Services in Wrexham'.

Should your circumstances change after you have submitted your application form and you need to change your preference of school, please contact the Admissions Office on 01978 297505.

Please detach and keep this letter, return the completed application form to the headteacher of your current school by 17 October 2008. If you have any concerns or queries about the contents of this letter, please contact the Admissions Office.

Parental Responsibility

Following changes made to the legislation regarding children in the Children Act 1989, which became law in October 1991, schools need to know who has 'parental responsibility' for each child. This is to ensure that proper authority is given when the school needs parental permission. It will also make sure that persons with parental responsibility, with whom the child does not live, can be provided with school reports and given an opportunity to be involved in the child's education. A parent in relation to a child or young person includes any person who, although not a parent, does have parental responsibility for the child. It also includes a person who has the daily care of the child. Persons who have parental responsibility automatically are:

- Mothers always have parental responsibility;
- Fathers also have parental responsibility for a child if the father is married to the mother at the time of the child's birth. This continues after any divorce/separation/remarriage even if the child lives apart from them;
- Unmarried fathers have parental responsibility where the mother and father register the birth of the child together (this is an amendment to the Children Act 1989 which came into force on the 1st December 2003 and is not retrospective);

Other people can attain parental responsibility under one of the following methods:

- a) Unmarried father gains parental responsibility:-
 - (i) upon marrying the mother;
 - (ii) by completing a parental responsibility agreement, obtained from a Court Office and to be completed by both the mother and the father;
 - (iii) by obtaining a Court Order giving the father parental responsibility
- b) A person who is appointed by the court or the parent as a guardian for the child gains parental responsibility at the time the appointment takes effect
- c) Where the court orders that the child shall reside with a named person, that person gains parental responsibility
- d) Adoptive parents of an adopted child have parental responsibility

Schools are required to keep, on the admission register, details for each child of every parent, or person with parental responsibility, details of the person(s) with actual custody of the child, and at least one telephone number where one of those persons can be contacted in the case of an emergency.
