

St. Mary's Voluntary Aided Church In Wales Primary School, Brymbo Admission Policy Document

The trust deed of the school, dated 18th November 1848, provides that the school is engaged in the education of the poor according to the principles of the Church in Wales (previously the Church of England) who live within the "ecclesiastical parish boundaries".

Therefore, in the event of there being more applications received than there are places available, places will be allocated as follows:

- 1) Those living within the "ecclesiastical parish", preference being given to those who live nearest to the school.
- 2) Siblings of children already in attendance.
- 3) Children whose parents are regular communicant members of St. Mary's Parish Church, Brymbo.
- 4) Children whose parents are regular communicant members of other Church in Wales churches.
- 5) Children whose parents attend a Christian church, but who do not fall within criterion 4 above.
- 6) Other children.

These rules do not apply to the provision of nursery education, which falls outside the statutory scheme.

Footnotes

All distances will be measured as on a straight line basis from the school building.

"Regular communicant" means a person who has received communion at least once per month during the twelve months preceding the date of application. Members of other denominations must have worshipped at least once per month during the twelve months preceding the date of application. In both cases, a letter of verification must be provided by the priest/minister.

Reference to parents includes either or both parents, or a sole parent, and where only one of two parents satisfies the criterion, the application will be treated equally with applications where the criterion is satisfied by both parents.

The expression "parents" includes legal guardians.
