How and where to pay



We offer a choice of payment dates if you choose to pay by Direct Debit. Ten monthly instalments on either the 5th, 20th or the last day of the month or by twelve monthly instalments on the 4th day of the month.

For a Direct Debit mandate please telephone 01978 292031.



You can make payment with most credit or debit cards through our automated telephone payment service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week using a touch tone telephone.

Please telephone 01978 292059 and follow the prompts given.



Council Tax payments can be made directly online on the Council's website www.wrexham.gov.uk.

All transactions are secure and are backed by VeriSign.



You can pay via your own internet banking page by quoting our bank details which are sort code 55-81-42 and number 96815256.

You must ensure you quote your payment reference number.



If you wish to pay by Post you should quote the Council Tax Reference Number. Cheques should be made payable to 'Wrexham County Borough Council'.

If you do require a receipt please send the whole document with a S.A.E.

What is Council Tax?



Council Tax is a locally raised tax that is payable on all domestic properties and it is made up of three separate elements:

Wrexham County Borough Council Charge

North Wales Police Authority Charge

Your Community Council Charge

Wrexham County Borough Council collects all of these charges and retains the amount due to itself and pays over to the Police Authority and the individual Community Councils the amounts collected on their behalf.

The amount you actually pay is dependant on the Band into which your property has been placed. These bands range from 'A to I' with 'A' being the lowest charge up to 'I' being the highest charge made.

The total amount payable is made up of two parts, 50% of which relates to the property and 50% relating to the occupier. The property part is payable under all circumstances but the personal element can be reduced if the property is occupied by fewer than two people.

If one person lives alone, the personal element of the tax payable is reduced by half, and if the property is vacant the personal element is not applicable.

How is my property valued?

The Valuation Office Agency (VOA) is responsible for valuing all domestic properties in England and Wales and placing your property in one of nine property bands.

The VOA is an independent Agency and not part of the Council. The VOA have calculated your valuation band based on property prices as at 1st April 2003. This is known as the 'valuation date'.

The set date ensures that all properties are assessed as at a fixed point in time, ensuring a fairer system for everyone.

The VOA takes account of the size, age, character and locality of your property and sales data from around the valuation date to arrive at the correct valuation band.

If your property was built after the 1st April 2003 the VOA will band your property according to what the value would have been on that date ,using comparable sales data.

Each property band has a range of values. The property bands and values for Wales are shown, in the table below.

Please note:

That under legislation for Wales any property in Wrexham which is unoccupied and furnished or has been unfurnished for a period of more than 6 months is charged at 100%

How to appeal

Council Tax

If you think your bill is too much because your property is in the wrong Band then you should appeal to the Valuation Office Agency (VOA) at Regent House, Regent Street, Wrexham or Telephone 01978 200000.

If you wish to appeal against liability you should firstly write to us putting forward your objections to our decision.

- We will then re-examine the matter and give you our decision.
- If you are still dissatisfied then you may appeal to the North Wales Valuation Tribunal at Government Buildings, Dinerth Road, Colwyn Bay, Conwy.

They are an independent body who will hear your case.

Housing/Council Tax Benefits

If you think the decision about your Housing or Council Tax benefit is wrong:

- You can ask us to explain it - please telephone or make a personal visit to Contact Wrexham, 16 Lord Street, Wrexham to discuss the matter with us.
- If you are not satisfied with the outcome, you can ask us to look at it again.
- If you remain dissatisfied, you should make a written request to the Council within one month of the date of notification.
- If you are still not happy with the Council decision you can appeal to an independent tribunal.

Business Rates

If you think your bill is too much because your Rateable Value is too high then you should appeal to the Valuation Office Agency (VOA) at Regent House, Regent Street, Wrexham or Telephone: 01978 200000.

If you wish to appeal against liability you should firstly write to us putting forward your objections to our decision and requesting that we review our decision.

Customer Complaints

If you are aggrieved at how we have dealt with your query you may write to:

Your rights Regarding Payment of Council Tax



Payment

If you wish, you can pay the whole bill in one instalment on or before 15 April 2011 or in two instalments on or before 15 April 2011 and 15 September 2011.

Instalments

You have a statutory right to pay by ten instalments from April 2011 to January 2012. Those whose liability begins later in the year are entitled to fewer instalments.

Reminders

If you fail to make an instalment by the 15th of each month then you will be issued with a reminder.

If you pay the missing instalment(s) within seven days then you may continue to pay by monthly instalments.

If you do not, then the full amount for the year is due.

2nd Reminders

If you fail to pay instalments a second time, then a second reminder will be issued.

If you do not pay within seven days you lose the right to pay monthly and the whole balance is due.

Final Reminders – 3rd Reminders

If you have already had two reminders and paid the missing instalments within seven days of the reminders, and you miss a third time **then the full balance outstanding is due immediately.**

Summons

After you lose the right to pay by instalments, the Council is required by law to issue a summons for the balance plus costs. These costs are currently £40.00 for the summons and £20.00 for the liability order.

Liability Order

Once a liability order has been obtained it gives the authority the right to:

- 1. Apply for an attachment to your earnings/Income support.**
- 2. Instruct a bailiff to seize your goods.**
- 3. Apply to the court to commit you to prison for non payment.**

But you can also agree with the Council Tax office to pay the balance weekly/monthly providing it is an acceptable figure.

Reliefs and Discounts



People with Disabilities

If you or someone who lives with you needs an extra room or extra space in your home because of a disability, you may be able to get a reduction in your bill. This reduction would be given by putting your home in a lower valuation band. If your home is in Band A, you may still qualify for a reduction. Please contact the Council for further information if you think you may qualify.

Discounts

If only one adult lives in a property a discount of 25% will apply. Discounts also apply to certain groups of people including students, student nurses, youth training trainees and the severely mentally impaired. If you think you may be entitled to a discount you should contact the Council.

If you have been granted a discount and you believe at any time you are no longer entitled to it, then you must inform the Council within 21 days. Failure to do so may result in a penalty.

Exempt Dwellings

Most dwellings will be subject to Council Tax, but some will be exempt and there will be no Council Tax to pay on them. These include properties where the only residents are students, or severely mentally impaired persons, and empty properties which:

- **are substantially unfurnished** (exempt for up to six months)
- **are owned by a charity** (exempt for up to six months)
- **are left empty by someone who has gone into prison, hospital or a nursing residential care home.**
- **are waiting for probate to be granted** (and for up to six months after grant of probate)
- **forms part of a single property with another dwelling, being the residence of a dependant relative** ("granny annexe")
- **are uninhabitable or undergoing structural repair/alterations** (exempt for up to twelve months)

Council Tax Data Matching

Wrexham Council is participating in an exercise to ensure that public money is being spent properly. Wrexham Council is under a duty to protect the public funds it administers. It may share information provided to it, with other bodies responsible for auditing or administering public funds, in order to prevent and detect fraud.

The Wales Audit Office currently require us to provide details of all Council Tax properties; liable persons; amounts payable – including discounts, exemptions and disregards so that the information can be compared with other information provided by other public bodies, in particular the Electoral Register and private organisations.



This data matching exercise should help ensure that discounts, exemptions and disregards are being applied appropriately and only to people entitled to receive them.



Remember

Benefit is only paid from the Monday following the receipt of your completed application form.

Applications must be made in writing and you must supply proof of income, capital and identity.



Remember

You should receive your benefit within two weeks of making a claim.

If you claim Income Support/Jobseekers Allowance you must make a separate claim for Council Tax/Housing Benefit.

Could I reduce my Council Tax or rent payments?

Am I entitled?

If you are on a low income or Income Support/Jobseekers Allowance?

Are you a pensioner on a low income?

If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then you may be entitled to help.

- **Council Tax**

If you are liable for Council Tax you could receive help with all or part of your bill.

- **Rent**

If you pay rent to Wrexham County Borough Council or to a private landlord, you may be entitled to help with the rent.

How do I apply?

Local Authority Tenants

Contact their local Estate Office and ask for a benefit form to help pay rent and Council Tax or by Telephone (01978) 292033.

Private Tenants and Owner Occupiers

Contact Wrexham Contact, 16 Lord Street, Wrexham or by telephone (01978 292033) and ask for a form for Rent Allowance and/or Council Tax Benefit.

Are you on Income Support?

Although you may be entitled to 100% benefit (less a deduction for certain other people over 18 in your home) it is not automatic and you must make an application to the Authority. If you do not you will lose benefit.

Are you an Owner Occupier?

Check your Council Tax demand. If there is no benefit shown and you have applied, contact us immediately.

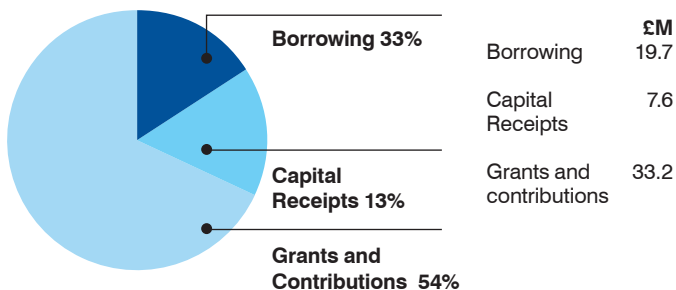

The past year has continued to see the difficult economic conditions which I referred to last year. The level of Government debt means that the public sector will see significant cuts in its funding during the next few years.

This year's budget therefore has been set against this backdrop but it also reflects increasing demands on many services particularly for vulnerable children and the elderly. That is why this year's Council Tax rise of 3% will again be amongst the lowest in Wales but also provides some degree of protection to services for the most vulnerable. We continue to believe that we need to invest in education in order to build a better future for our county. That is why we have also protected our schools from any cuts to their budgets for the sixth successive year.

It is worth noting that our efforts to maintain Council Tax rises at relatively low levels for the last 6 years means that Wrexham now has the seventh lowest Council tax in England and Wales.

We have also experienced another severe winter which has led to a deterioration in road surfaces and we plan to invest a further £1 million on a road re-surfacing programme which builds on the additional £1 million that we have spent in the past year. We also continue to work on the three Council priorities which we shall also fund from our budgets. During the year we plan to make significant announcements which will increase the number of affordable homes available for our residents in the county and also provide energy efficiency and renewable energy schemes to reduce our carbon emissions.

We continue to see sustained improvement in many of our services which is being recognised by external inspectors. The challenge for us in coming years will be to maintain standards at a time of falling public expenditure and that is why we need to transform the way that we deliver many of our services.

In Wrexham we have in recent years involved councillors in monthly budget monitoring and they are involved in the planning process from the outset. Even as I write this letter we are working with our officers to plan the budget for 2012/13 in the belief that this forward planning will protect the quality of our services to the greatest extent possible in this difficult economic situation. I hope that you recognise the Council's drive to focus on service improvement but as always please feel free to contact me if you have any comments on Council services.

As in previous years we have to include the demand from North Wales Police for the provision of their services and a separate leaflet from them explains their expenditure.

What We Have Achieved During the Year!

Affordable Housing

In order to increase the provision of affordable housing in Wrexham County Borough work has taken place to identify council-owned sites for affordable housing development and support has been obtained to enter into a Joint Venture Agreement with the Welsh Assembly Government and a Developer/Registered Social Landlord with the scope to provide up to 400 units of affordable housing. In the last year the Council has also received an allocation of £1.3 million from the WAG to support the purchase of affordable homes.

Despite this the housing market is likely to remain fairly flat for the foreseeable future with the most significant impediment to the creation and uptake of affordable homes being a very cautious lending sector. To assist potential home buyers annual home buyer fairs are being held within Wrexham to generate interest in shared ownership affordable homes.

Better education & skill for employment

Work continues towards achieving a reduction in the percentage of people of working-age who are economically inactive. The objective is to reduce the proportion of Wrexham County Borough pupils leaving school at year 11 who are known to not be in employment, education or training (NEET). In 2009 Wrexham County Borough Council showed the greatest improvement in Wales on this indicator; in 2008, 145 of Wrexham's Year 11 school leavers were known to be 'NEET'.

In 2009 this was halved, falling to 72. To ensure continued success an evidence-based model for more consistently and reliably identifying those most at risk of going on to be 'NEET' is being developed. We will also work to increase the number of pupils leaving year 11 who are continuing in full-time education.

Carbon emissions & energy use reduced

Work has taken place alongside the Carbon Trust and the Energy Saving Trust with the overall aim of reducing carbon emissions and energy use, optimising energy efficiency and using renewable energy where possible across the County Borough. A budget of £2.4 million has been secured through bids to Salix Finance and the WAG Invest to Save Fund which builds upon our existing energy conservation budget.

This will enable us to significantly improve the energy efficiency of our non domestic buildings stock and our street lighting network over the coming years. This work will also assist in avoiding increasingly large financial penalties for our Carbon Emissions through the 'Carbon Reduction Commitment'.

Healthy Eating & people being more active

Continued good progress has been made towards encouraging people to eat more healthily and be more active. An exercise has been undertaken to review menu options in schools and revised menus are now in use with some food items with a high fat content removed and more healthy alternatives being offered. In order to encourage and enable more children to walk or cycle to school three new safe routes have been completed during the year in local communities.

The number of residents using leisure facilities has seen an increase of 25% compared to the previous year and the number of people attending the visitor's centres at Ty Mawr, Alyn Waters and Nant Mill has increased with 213,212 visits, compared to 188,207 in the previous year.

Anti-Social Behaviour, Substance Misuse and Perceptions of Crime

Excellent work has continued to help reduce antisocial behaviour and substance misuse. We also continue to keep residents informed in order to help improve perception

of crime rates, to better reflect reality. The Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) agreement we have with North Wales Police continues to make a significant impact in the Borough as over 80% of PCSO time continues to be spent in target communities. There has also been a 7.5% reduction in reported anti-social behaviour incidents.

Assisting Older People to Live Independently

Good progress is continuing to be made in order to assist older people to live independently. Significant progress has been made in developing the reablement service and the continued roll out of Telecare has enabled more people to be supported to live in their own homes, with over 400 new service users for the year. Community based services have also been strengthened and there have been 10 additional lunch clubs developed during the year which as well as providing a nutritious meal, are a valuable social opportunity for those who attend.

Waste Minimisation and Recycling

Are you doing enough recycling? Progress towards minimising waste and increasing recycling across the County Borough is on track with a combined recycling and composting rate which exceeds the statutory target of 40%.

The increase in recycling and composting follows the successful roll out of kitchen waste and cardboard collection schemes, and numerous recycling awareness raising activities which have been carried out across the county borough. Wrexham Recycling Park is now fully operational along with the three Household Recycling Centres at Bryn Lane, Brymbo and Plas Madoc.

Access and Influence Services

Work continues in order to improve customer's access to services and improve how the Council consult and engage the public and use that information to influence service design and delivery.

The services offered by 'Contact Wrexham' have continued to grow throughout the year, with new services being taken into the contact centre and new transactional services available through the website. Promote Equality of opportunity for Children and Young People to become Bilingual and to Promote the Welsh Culture

Demand for Welsh medium education in Wrexham County Borough is increasing and detailed work has been undertaken during the year to establish the strategies and proposals required for providing further Welsh medium provision within the county borough. Customer satisfaction with Council services in the Welsh language is high and there continues to be an increase in the number of people attending cultural programmes or events delivered in the medium of the Welsh language across the county borough.

Safeguarding Our Children

In 2009/10, the Safeguarding and Support department saw an overall 22% increase in contacts, resulting in 40% more initial and core assessments being completed over the year. As a result, whilst the number of timely initial and core assessments has increased significantly on previous years, this was not reflected in the percentage performance.

Performance regarding referrals and assessments remains a key area for improvement and is subject to weekly analysis, with improvements evident in the latter months of the year and early part of 2010/11. However, services to Wrexham's most vulnerable children remains a high profile activity for the Council with indications being that the current level of demand on the service will continue.
