Purpose for processing:

- Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (Section 37):
Aim of the youth justice system.E+W
(1) It shall be the principal aim of the youth justice system to prevent offending by children and young persons.
(2) In addition to any other duty to which they are subject, it shall be the duty of all persons and bodies carrying out functions in relation to the youth justice system to have regard to that aim.
- Under Sections 17 and 115 of the C& D Act, the Youth Justice Service process and shares information to prevent offending and re-offending of children and young people referred.
- Disclosure to third parties, in cases of Harmful Sexual Behaviour.
