WREXHAM COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 The Queensway Alley Gating Public Spaces Protection Order 2021

Notice is hereby given that Wrexham County Borough Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 59, 64 and 72 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 ("the Act") and under all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order known as: The Queensway Alley Gating Public Spaces Protection Order 2021

- 1. The Order will apply to the adopted footpaths in the Queensway Ward of Caia Park, Wrexham as described in Schedule 1 below and as shown on the attached plans ("the Order plans") unless otherwise specified.
- 2. The Council is satisfied that the two conditions below have been met, in that:
- (a) activities carried on in the restricted area as described in Schedule 1 have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, or it is likely that these activities will be carried on in the public place and they will have such an effect;
- (b) the effect, or likely effect, of the activities is, or is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature, is, or is likely to be, such as to make the activities unreasonable, and justifies the restrictions imposed by the Order.
- 3. The order will come into force on 11 March 2021 and will have effect for a period of three years thereafter unless extended by further orders under the Council's statutory powers.

BY THIS ORDER

Prohibitions and/or requirements

- 4. The effect of the order is to restrict entry along the footpaths referred to at Schedule 1 and as shown on the attached plans at all times except for the owners or occupiers of the properties adjoining the said highways affected by this order who need to access their properties.
- 5. The order authorises the installation of lockable gates at Wrexham County Borough Council Adopted Footpaths next to/between:

- 7. Police, Fire and Ambulance emergency services, statutory undertakers with equipment situated under, over, along or in the highway, council officers and other persons authorised by the Council, shall be exempt from the provisions of this Order.
- 8. Responsibility for the maintenance of the gates will lie with Wrexham Borough County Council.
- 9. The Council is satisfied that the conditions set out in Sections 59, 64 and 72 of the Act have been satisfied and that it is in all the circumstances expedient to make this Order for the purposes of reducing disproportionately high volumes of acquisitive crime in the restricted areas. The Council makes the Order because the anti-social behaviour has had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. The effect or likely effect of this is of a persistent or continuing nature such as to make this unreasonable and justifies the restrictions imposed by the Order.

Appeals

A challenge to the Order must be made at the High Court by an interested person within 6 weeks of it being made. An interested person is someone who lives in, regularly works in or visits the restricted area. This means that only those who are directly affected by the restrictions have the power to challenge. The right to challenge also exists where an order is varied by the Council.

When an application is made the High Court can decide to suspend the operation of the Order pending the Court's decision, in part or in totality. The High Court has the ability to uphold the Order, quash it, or vary it.

Interested persons can challenge the validity of the Order on two grounds: that the Council did not have the power to make the Order or to include particular prohibitions or requirements: or that one of the requirements of the legislation, for instance consultation, has not been complied with. When an application is made the High Court can decide to suspend the operation of the Order pending the Court's decision, in part or in totality. The High Court has the ability to uphold the Order, quash it, or vary it.






MAP 2 Cefndre
